STUDENT BEHAVIOUR PROGRESS


ANALYSING DATA FROM WEEK 1-5 (TERM 4)

TIER 3

- I had 6+ behaviour incidents this
- My behaviour is 'Case Managed' by a team of support staff
- My parent/guardians are in regular contact with Mrs Kelly (our Inclusion Teacher)
- My behaviour is tracked and teachers help me to check-in each
- My teachers celebrated me when I had a personal success with my behaviour choices

TIER 2

- I had 2-5 behaviour incidents this
- I have visited the 'Reset Room' at lunchtime
- I have behaviour goals set with my teachers
- My parent/quardians are in
- contact with my teachers My teachers noticed when I made good behaviour choices and gave me lots of positive feedback





- We had 0-1 behaviour incidents this term
- We were taught the Rule of the Week
- We demonstrated the 3 school rules
- We received Blackall Bucks
- We may have received a positive postcard, phone call home, or a Student of the Week award
- Teachers constantly gave me positive feedback about my behaviour

BEHAVIOUR IMPROVEMENTS

- ullet Less major & minor incidents than the previous data.
- Less playtime incidentsThe majority of students are responding to Tier I supports.

MOST FREQUENT INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOURS

- Non-compliance with routine*
- Disruption*
- · Verbal misconduct
