Australian Early Development Census (AEDC) – Prep Students This Term, our school, along with thousands of others across the country will begin preparations for the fifth Australian Early Development Census (AEDC). The AEDC gives us a national picture of the development, health and wellbeing of chil-

dren in their first year of full-time school. Since 2009, the census results have helped communities, schools and governments plan services and develop better policies to target support for children and families. The AEDC gives us data at a school and community level—it isn't an assessment of individual children. Participation in the AEDC

is voluntary. Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census. Further information has been sent to Prep parents.
